

Programme of Study



Subject: Latin

Year: 9

Autumn 1

Introduction to the Olympian gods, including the family relationships between them and their powers and associations.

Reminder of Latin conventions and revision of grammatical endings and roles.

Autumn 2

Study of important Roman heroes from myth and history, including Hercules and Aeneas.

Continuation of Latin grammar including neuter nouns, the full range of adjectives, prepositions and the perfect tense.

Spring 1

Study of gods particularly important to the Romans, such as Jupiter, household gods and the concept of deification.

Continuation of Latin grammar including the ablative case, adverbs, verb conjugations and the imperfect tense.

Spring 2

Study of Roman worship and beliefs about divine favour and punishment.

Continuation of Latin grammar including irregular verbs, direct questions and the genitive and dative cases.

Summer 1

Study of Roman festivals, games and shows.

Continuation of Latin grammar including the present tense and present participles.

Summer 2

Study of fate and prophecy, including oracles and omens.

Continuation of Latin grammar including commands, numbers, time phrases and the future tense.
