




From the youngest pupils in the nursery to our sixth form students, there are opportunities for everyone to learn and grow.

At Key Stage 1, we offer Forest School, workshops, visiting teachers and speakers. Our juniors and seniors participate in concerts, music lessons, LAMDA, trips, charity events, numerous extra-curricular clubs and drama productions, including an annual musical performance where senior pupils can showcase their talents.

We have an active House system in school. Pupils participate in competitions where they can represent their House including a Challoner's Got Talent music competition and Sports Day, which also carries House points and enables pupils from different year groups to work together as a team.

Underpinning all aspects of the Chaplaincy programme is the provision of good pastoral care, which includes supporting individuals who are facing challenges in their life.


Pupils can become altar servers under the guidance of the Chaplain and we also prepare participating Year 3 pupils for their First Holy Communion.
