
Our motto 'Quantum Potes Tantum Aude' challenges each member of our community to dare to do their very best.

# **The School Day**

A short break may be taken during the afternoon.

The school gate opens at 8.20am where pupils are supervised by staff until they are collected by their class teacher. Pupils may be dropped off from 8.20am.

# Wraparound Care

We have an extensive range of after school clubs which run on every day of the week. For those who need care outside of the normal school hours and after school clubs, we offer Breakfast Club and after school club for an additional fee.

#### **Breakfast Club**

At Bishop Challoner Breakfast Club opens from 07:15 to the start of the school day at 08:30. Breakfast is served until 08:05.

We aim to provide an emotionally and physically safe environment for children; an environment where children feel comfortable, where their selfconfidence, sense of responsibility, and an awareness of others can grow in a positive direction. Because it is important that they are alert and calm at the start of the school day, children are provided with healthy options for breakfast; low sugar/low additive cereals, wholemeal toast, pancakes, spreads, fruit, fruit juice, fromage frais and Baby Bel. Water and milk is always available. Bishop Challoner is a "Nut Free" School.

While eating, children are encouraged to chat quietly, calmly, and politely.



After breakfast, children can choose from a wide range of activities and are encouraged to play independently, imaginatively and fairly. There are a variety of independent and adult lead craft activities planned throughout the year.

At the end of a session, children are taken to the KS1 playground where they line up with their classes.

#### **After School Club**

The onsite After School Club runs from 3.15pm till 6pm for children in Nursery to Year 4. Pupils in Years 5 and 6 may attend from 5pm after Homework Club. We offer a safe and secure environment where children can relax and play under the supervision of qualified staff. We provide adult directed activities, e.g. craft, cooking and games alongside child-led free play. The children may choose from the various accessible, age appropriate resources and are encouraged to engage socially with children from other year groups therefore strengthening relationships within the school community.

# **Pastoral Care**

At Bishop Challoner, we recognise that pastoral care is inextricably linked with teaching and learning. Children are more likely to achieve their potential when they are happy in their learning, well-motivated and proud of what they have achieved. We ensure that each pupil receives the care, guidance and support needed to fulfil their academic potential.



We promote positive attitudes and children are rewarded and praised for excellent effort, high standards of work, showing care to others and taking responsibility.

In Early Years and KS1, the pupils follow the golden rules:

- 1) Treat others as you would like to be treated;
- 2) Be polite and well mannered;
- 3) Listen to adults at school and do as you are asked;
- 4) Look after your own and other people's belongings;
- 5) Keep yourself and your surroundings tidy.

# In KS2, pupils follow the preparatory school Code of Conduct:

 Treat other people as you would like to be treated, be kind, thoughtful and caring, listen when others are speaking;

2) Show respect for other people's views and property;

 Always try to be cheerful, and polite and well-mannered to both adults and children; 4) Always ensure that you are neat and tidy and wearing the correct uniform;

5) Look after your belongings and keep our school tidy;

6) Always try to be punctual for your lessons and move around the school in a quiet and controlled manner.



We understand that often pupils need someone to talk to and so we run a Listening Ear. This takes place in the Preparatory School office at the following times:

> Monday 11.50-12.15 with Mr Peck Tuesday 11.50-12.15 with Ms Hoyles Friday 11.50-12.15 with Mrs Bateman

Pupils demonstrating good behaviour receive points on Class Dojo. They work together to reach a class target of points which results in an own clothes day as reward. Individually they earn points to each their star awards. Pupils start with their green badge in year 1 and work their way through as they progress up the year groups.



# Curriculum

We teach a broad curriculum throughout the Preparatory School, enabling pupils to learn through a wide range of opportunities and practical experiences. Some subjects are taught by the class teacher and other lessons are delivered by specialist teachers.

Classroom lessons are supplemented with a range of trips and visits, with workshops and special events also regularly taking place.

A curriculum map is sent home termly giving details of the topics that will be covered in all subjects. This will also provide details of PE days and homework expectations.

In September, we hold an Information Evening where parents meet with their child's class teacher to discuss the curriculum and aims for the year.

# Homework

Pupils will receive homework regularly in line with the homework timetable. From Year 1 to Year 5 homework is sent home on Friday to be returned the following Wednesday.

In year 6, pupils are set homework throughout the week.

In years 5 and 6, homework is recorded on Satchel One. Across the preparatory school, teachers will log homework on Class Dojo and also share what has been taught throughout the week. Responsibilities Pupils

- to complete homework to the best of his/her ability
- to take the opportunity to develop self-disciplined methods of work
- to recognise the need to complete work within a given time and to keep to deadlines
- to take the opportunity to use resources such as libraries, ICT or personal contacts

## Teachers

- to set homework which is relevant to the learning in class
- To ensure pupils fully understand the homework and that the task is accessible to them
- to ensure homework is handed in on time
- to foster links between school and parents, through Class Dojo

## Parents

- to ensure appropriate working conditions
- to monitor the actual amount of time spent on homework
- to encourage pupils to use a wide range of resources outside school

Preparatory school teachers are always happy to discuss homework requirements with you. Please do not hesitate to contact your child's class teacher should you wish to do so.

# iPads

Pupils in years 5 and 6 are issued a school iPad and pen. It is the child's responsibility to ensure that it is in school every day, fully charged.

The younger pupils have access to a class set of iPads to further their learning.



## Assessment and feedback to parents

All pupils complete online testing at the beginning of the school year. We use INCAS assessments from the Centre for Evaluation and Monitoring. These results will be shared with parents during the October Parents' Evening.

Pupils are then assessed termly in English and Maths using NTS assessment tests.

Other subjects are assessed at the end of a programme of study.

Progress reports are sent home every half term.

Parents' Evenings are held twice yearly in October and February and teachers are always readily

available to meet with parents to discuss pupil progress at other times throughout the year.

#### Attendance

Regular attendance at school is very important. Teachers do their best to help pupils catch up with work they have missed but there are two things that must be kept in mind:

- Work set for absent pupils to do at home is never as effective as work done in class; pupils do need the support of the teacher in their learning.
- Teachers need to give pupils who have been absent extra time and attention in class and that is at the expense of other pupils.

Please notify the school by telephone on every day of the absence. It is also useful to inform the class teacher via email or Class Dojo.

Please avoid arranging family holidays in term time. If you are obliged to remove your child from school for this or any other reason, you should obtain permission from the Headteacher or Head of Section at least two weeks in advance.

## **Punctuality**

Please ensure that all children arrive for school on time so that they are ready for the beginning of the school day. Lateness not only disrupts the learning of the individual but interrupts the learning of the whole class. Pupils are expected to be on the school site by 8.30am and registration takes place at 8.35am.

Pupils who arrive after the gates have closed at 8.35am must report to the Reception Desk. Preparatory pupils will then be escorted to their classes or to the hall for assembly.



## **House System**

The aim of the House System is to enhance group and team spirit, whilst encouraging a sense of loyalty, duty and friendly competition.

All pupils are in one of the four houses which are part of the pastoral system running throughout the school from nursery to sixth form. Sixth form pupils are selected as head of each house and are supported by staff member who are all allocated a house. The Preparatory School elect House Captains and Vice Captains each year and these pupils represent the school in House activities.

When a pupil is recognised for achievement, a Dojo point is awarded and all points accumulate as part of the whole school house system. The house system is based on competition, charity fundraising and sports days. Throughout the year a number of house competitions run across a variety of subjects, including Easter egg design, Christmas card design, Creative writing challenges, Inter-house sporting events, debating competitions and many more. There are regular house assemblies led by the Head of House. There are various cups and shields which are awarded throughout the year for events such as sports days.

At the end of the academic year, the house with the most points is awarded the House Cup.

#### **Uniform and Appearance**

All clothing must be clearly and securely named. In any dispute over uniform regulations, the

Headteacher's judgment is final.

A full and up to date list of uniform can be found on the school website. School uniform should be worn properly. Pupils are representing the school in the community and must look smart at all times. School uniform must be worn to and from school, on all school occasions, and when the school is being represented at games fixtures either home or away.

Pupils in Reception – Year 4 are expected to wear their school hats to and from school every day.

Class teachers will check school uniform, hairstyles and jewellery daily and will inform parents of any incorrect uniform. Jewellery and other inappropriate items will be confiscated and passed on to the Heads of KS1 and KS2 for safekeeping.

#### Jewellery

- Only girls are allowed one small pair of plain stud earrings, gold or silver to be worn in the lower lobe of each ear.
- No facial/body piercings are allowed.
- No other jewellery is allowed (religious or otherwise)
- Small watches are allowed and are the responsibility of the pupil.
- Badges (metal lapel badges and other insignia) – only authorised school badges are allowed

#### Hair

- Hair should not be dyed, highlighted or unnaturally coloured and should be tidy and not unacceptably long, excessively short or obscure vision, no channels are allowed in hair or eyebrows.
- Long hair must be tied back throughout the school day.
- No extreme hairstyles (as defined by the Headteacher), hair extensions or braids are permitted.
- Hair ribbons, slides should be navy, black or maroon.

#### Makeup

• No makeup or nail varnish is permitted.

#### Shoes

- Shoes must be plain black leather (no canvas, no suede, no cord, no trainers, no metal attachments, no industrial style, no boots) lace up or slip on with low heel
- Leather Nike trainer shoes are not permitted.
- Must be kept clean
- Trainers may be worn at break or in the lunch hour for sport
- School shoes must be worn to and from school

### Year 6 Leadership Team

In Year 6, pupils are invited to write a letter of application for the Year 6 Leadership Team. There are a number of roles available, including Head Pupils, Sports Captains, House Captains and Prefects.

All pupils on the leadership team carry out a number of duties such as:

- Play leader in the EYFS and KS1 playground
- Dining room support for EYFS and KS1
- Reading support for EYFS and KS1
- Assembly Leaders
- Catholic Value Leaders
- Attendance and Punctuality Leaders
